1. Get the information.

Find someone and chat about what you're learning. This could be a one-on-one, a small group, or you and your spouse. Talk once, talk every week, or talk once a month. Find whatever works for you!

3. Practice it.

Identify times and places where you can invest in intergenerational relationships. Each study has great ideas to help you put these things into motion.

I Still Have Questions...

Why are we all studying the same thing? Because family is important. Important enough for us all to take a closer look at it. Kids need to learn they have a church family to care for them even as their parents take the primary role in raising them. Parents need to know they have the church supporting them as they raise their kids. And as a church, we've already made it quite clear we value intergenerational relationships. The church family will have this study as another opportunity to learn how we can come alongside the kids and parents in our congregation and in our community.

So, is this a small group thing or a "do it yourself" thing or what? Honestly, whatever works best for you! We understand that everyone learns differently and everyone has different schedules. So study it on your own or with your spouse. Or get together with some friends. If you do choose to study it alone, we still hope you'll talk to someone else at some point so you can share what you're learning and get more ideas!

Want a small group? If you want to join up with other WPC'ers for a study, let the church office know. We'll compile a list and allow you to set your time and place.

Don't go online? That's okay! The book for parents is *Parenting Beyond Your Capacity* by Reggie Joiner and Carey Nieuwhof. The book for extended family is *Playing for Keeps* by Reggie Joiner and Kristen Ivy. Each one has discussion questions included.
